General Purposes Committee of Council

The General Purposes Committee of Council has made the following changes to regulations, to come into effect on **12 December**, unless notice of a resolution calling

(a) Bukhman Professorship of Type 1 Diabetes

Explanatory Note

The University has received a donation from the Bukhman Foundation, which has permitted the establishment of a research centre into Type 1 diabetes, and a statutory Chair, for a period of 7 years. These regulations are being created to reflect the establishment of the statutory Bukhman Professorship of Type 1 Diabetes.

Text of Regulations

In [Council Regulations 24 of 2002](#), concerning individual professorships, insert:

‘The Bukhman Professorship of Type 1 Diabetes

1. The Bukhman Professor of Type 1 Diabetes shall engage in advanced study and research and shall lecture and give instruction in type 1 diabetes.
2. The professor shall be elected by an electoral board consisting of:

(b) Hicks Professor of Economics

Explanatory Note

These proposed changes are to update the membership of the electoral board to reflect the current department and divisional structure, and to add research into the role description.

Text of Regulations

In [Council Regulations 24 of 2002](#), concerning the Hicks Professor of Economics, amend as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

- ‘1. The Sir John Hicks Professor of Economics shall undertake research, lecture and give instruction in economics.
2. The professor shall be elected by an electoral board consisting of:

(1) the Vice-Chancellor; or, if the head of the college specified in (2) of this clause is Vice-Chancellor, a person appointed by Council;

upon Council to annul or amend the regulation is received by the Registrar by **noon on 1 December** (as set out in [Statute VI: Council](#)).

(1) the Vice-Chancellor;

(2) the head of the college to which the Chair may be allocated by Council from time to time; or, if the head is unable or unwilling to act, a person appointed by the governing body of that college;

(3) A person appointed by the governing body of the college specified in clause (2);

(6)–(9) four persons appointed by the Medical Sciences Board;

(10) a person appointed by the body or bodies which may issue an honorary clinical contract or contracts to the professor.

3. The professor shall be subject to the General Provisions of the regulations concerning the duties of professors and to those Particular Provisions of the same regulations which are applicable to this chair.’

(2) the head of the college to which the professorship shall be for the time being allocated by Council under any decree in that behalf, or, if the head is unable or unwilling to act, a person appointed by the governing body of the college;

(3) a person appointed by the governing body of the college specified in (2) of this clause;

~~(7)–(9) three persons appointed by the Board of the Faculty of Social Studies.~~

(c) Wykeham Professorship of Logic

Explanatory Note

The following changes are being made to include research in the duties of the professor and to update the membership of the electoral board.

Text of Regulations

In [Council Regulations 24 of 2002](#), concerning the Wykeham Professor of Logic, amend as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

‘Wykeham Professor of Logic

1. The Wykeham Professor of Logic shall undertake research and teaching~~lecture and give instruction~~ in Philosophy with special regard to the Problems, Theories, and History of Logic.

3. The professor shall be subject to the General Provisions of the regulations~~decree~~ concerning the duties of professors and to those Particular Provisions of the same regulations~~decree~~ which are applicable to this chair.’

Congregation 16 December

Voting on changes to Congregation Regulations 3 of 2002: Religious Services and Sermons

Explanatory Note

The following proposed changes, made on the recommendation of the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers, amend the regulations relating to Religious Services and Sermons to provide for a new University Sermon on Interfaith Relations to foster good interfaith relations within the University and promote discussion about the vital part played by faith communities in the public sphere. The University Sermon on Interfaith Relations would be held within colleges.

Changes to regulations 6.8–6.10 were approved by Congregation on 14 October. This second tranche of changes is now submitted because they were omitted from the published notice (see [Gazette No 5466, 25 September 2025, p7](#)). For completeness, the agreed changes are all shown below, along with additional

changes. Following approval of the partial changes to the regulations set out in the *Gazette* on 25 September, the numbering of the published regulations was updated to reflect the agreed changes. The proposed changes set out below are to the version of the regulation published prior to 14 October; struck-through numbering thus refers to that earlier version rather than the currently published regulations.

Text of Regulations

In Part 6 of [Congregation Regulations 3 of 2002](#), concerning the conduct of ceremonies in Congregation and certain other ceremonies, amend regulation 6 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

The qualification of preachers

6.8 [With the exception of the University Sermon on Interfaith Relations,](#) ~~t~~The Vice-Chancellor and the committee may use such liberty in nominating preachers as may be exercised by a Diocesan Bishop in accordance with resolutions of the Convocations of the Church of England.

[6.9 For the University Sermon on Interfaith Relations, the Vice-Chancellor and the committee may nominate a preacher of any faith community in the venue for the sermon.](#)

6.9~~10~~ At least three sermons each year shall be preached by members of Congregation.

The payment of preachers

6.11~~10~~ Council shall determine the payments to be made to preachers nominated under these regulations, including travelling expenses if any preacher is not resident in Oxford, except those nominated under regulations 6.19~~17~~ (1) and 6.19~~17~~ (2) below.

Holy Communion

6.12~~11~~ In the week before each Full Term, the Holy Communion according to the Liturgy of the Church of England shall be celebrated in the Church of St Mary the Virgin, by an individual appointed by the Vice-Chancellor.

Sermons to be preached in Full Term in St Mary's Church

6.13~~12~~ Sermons shall be preached before the University in St Mary's Church on certain days, namely:

- (1) on two Sundays during Michaelmas Full Term, to be determined by the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers;
- (2) on two Sundays during Hilary Full Term, excepting the first day of Hilary Full Term, to be determined by the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers;
- (3) on the first day of Hilary Full Term, the Latin Sermon (to be preached in accordance with Regulations 6.13 and 6.14 below); and
- (4) on no more than two Sundays during Trinity Full Term:
 - (a) one to be on the third Sunday of term, or such date as the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers shall determine, the Commemoration Day Sermon; and
 - (b) one, if any, to be determined by the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers.

6.14~~13~~ On the first day of Hilary Full Term a Latin Sermon (to be preceded by the Litany read by one of the Proctors or by another member of Convocation appointed by them) shall be preached in the Church of St Mary the Virgin by individuals nominated by the Faculty of Classics.

6.15~~14~~ If the Faculty of Classics should fail to nominate the preacher, or if the preacher nominated should be prevented by sudden illness or other urgent cause from preaching, the Vice-Chancellor shall appoint some other qualified individual to replace that preacher.

Sermons on the Grace of Humility and the Sin of Pride

6.16~~15~~ The Sermons on the Grace of Humility and on the Sin of Pride, for which a benefaction was given to the University in 1684 by the Revd William Master, Vicar of Preston, near Cirencester, shall be preached on Quinquagesima Sunday and the last Sunday before Advent respectively, on one of a selection of texts specified by the benefactor.

The Ramsden Sermon

6.17~~16~~ The Ramsden Sermon, for which a benefaction (now known as the Ramsden Benefaction) was given to the University by Mr J.H. Markland in 1847, shall be preached upon 'Church Extension within the British Commonwealth'.

[6.18 A Sermon on Interfaith Relations shall be preached in rotation in Colleges, as determined by the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers, by individuals of any faith community, nominated by the Committee.](#)

Sermons to be preached elsewhere than in St Mary's Church

6.19~~17~~ Sermons shall be preached before the University in certain colleges, on certain days, namely:

- (1) in the Cathedral Church of Christ on the first Sunday in Advent and on Whitsunday;
- (2) in Magdalen College, on the Sunday in Full Term nearest St Mark's Day, and on the ninth Sunday of Trinity Term;
- (3) in Oriel College, on the eighth Sunday of Hilary Full Term;
- (4) in Hertford College, the Macbride Sermon (preached in accordance with Part 34 of the Schedule to the Statutes) on the second Sunday in Hilary Term;

Latin Sermon

(5) in the Cathedral Church of Christ, when a Court Sermon is required;

(6) in Queen's College, on Trinity Sunday;

(7) in rotation, in one of those colleges and societies which have so agreed with the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers, the Ramsden Sermon (preached in accordance with Regulation 6.16 above), on the fourth Sunday of Michaelmas Full Term;

(8) in rotation, in one of those colleges and societies which have so agreed with the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers, the Sermon on the Sin of Pride (preached in accordance with Regulation 6.15 above), on the last Sunday before Advent;

(9) in rotation, in one of those colleges and societies which have so agreed with the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers, the Sermon on the Grace of Humility (preached in accordance with Regulation 6.15 above), on Quinquagesima Sunday;

(10) in rotation, the Sermon on Interfaith Relations (preached in accordance with Regulation 6.18 above)

Meeting information

Members of Congregation are reminded that any two members may, not later than **noon on 8 December**, give notice in writing to the Registrar that they wish to oppose or amend the changes to Congregation regulations above (see the note on the conduct of

in Colleges on a Sunday in full term, as agreed by the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers, or the committee may determine that the Sermon on Interfaith Relations may replace one of the existing University Sermons in any given year.

6.20~~18~~ In each instance, except those detailed in 6.19~~17~~ (4), 6.19~~17~~ (5), 6.19~~17~~ (7), 6.19~~17~~ (8), ~~and~~ 6.19~~17~~ (9) ~~and~~ 6.19 (10) above, the preacher shall be appointed by the college.

Commemoration of benefactors

6.21~~19~~ The preacher, in a prayer before the University sermon specified in Regulation 6.13~~12~~ (4) (a) above, shall make a grateful commemoration of the benefactors of the University, recalling by name those whom Council has decreed shall be commemorated in this way. The list of names shall be divided into six sections, one of which shall be read out in turn at each successive commemoration. The list shall be held by the Committee for the Nomination of Select Preachers and shall be presented to the committee at its meeting in each Michaelmas Term.'
