## Council of the University

### Income grant from the Oxford College Contributions Fund

#### *Explanatory Note*

This regulation authorises an income grant from the Oxford College Contributions Fund, on the recommendation of the College Contributions Committee following that committee's consideration of a new application submitted in 2025–26.

#### *Text of Regulations*

The following amount shall be paid as an income grant to the college named, under the provisions of Part B: Oxford College Contributions Fund of Statute XV, for application in the financial year shown:

The sum listed is a maximum. Payment of the grant shall be dependent on the success with which the college meets certain conditions laid down by Council on the recommendation of the College Contributions Committee.

## Council of the University

Council has made the following changes to regulations, to come into effect on 17 July, unless notice of a resolution calling upon Council to annul or amend the

regulation is received by the Registrar by **noon on 13 July** (as set out in section 19(1)(a) of [Statute VI: Council](#)).

### (a) Regulations for the Employment of University Staff

#### *(i) Explanatory Note*

On 18 October 2021, General Purposes Committee approved a change to the title of the Professor of Computing to the Christopher Strachey Professor of Computing. The Schedule of Statutory Professorships set out in Council Regulations 3 of 2004, which lists the titles of all the Statutory Professorships at the University of Oxford, was not updated to reflect the agreed change. Approval is now being sought to align the regulations with the change made to the title of the Professor of Computing.

#### *Text of Regulations*

In [Council Regulations 3 of 2004: Regulations for the Employment of University Staff](#), amend Table 6: Schedule of Statutory Professorships as follows (new text underlined):

‘Christopher Strachey Professor of Computing’.

*(ii) Explanatory Note*

On 5 May 2026, General Purposes Committee (GPC) approved a change to the title of the Professor of Old Age Psychiatry in Council Regulations 24 of 2002 to the Professor of Dementia Research (see [Gazette No 5492, 14 May 2026, p500](#)), on the basis that changing the name to focus on dementia would retain a clinical relevance to the research but also broaden the eligibility criteria, enabling other relevant clinical professions to apply, not just old age psychiatrists. GPC has authority to approve the change to Council Regulations 24 of 2002 but not the corresponding change to Council Regulations 3 of 2004 that lists the titles of all the Statutory Professorships at the University of Oxford, which needed the approval of Council.

**(b) Nominations Committee***Explanatory Note*

These changes are proposed to allow the Nominations Committee to use methods to identify suitable candidates for external membership of Council, in addition to the usual invitation for nominations from members of the University, and to permit automatic extension of the membership of any member of the committee until the completion of any exercise of which they have been a part. The opportunity is being taken to change instances of ‘his or her’ to ‘their’ etc. Numbers are also being written as numerals rather than words, in line with Oxford style guidance.

*Text of Regulations*

In [Part 24 of Council Regulations 15 of 2002](#), amend paragraphs 1.3 and 2.4 of Part 24 as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

‘1.1. The Nominations Committee shall consist of:

- (1) a person appointed by Council from among current or former external members of Council;
- (2) a person appointed by Council from among current external members of Council;
- (3) a person appointed by Council from among the members of Council;
- (4) one of the Proctors or the Assessor *ex officio* as may be agreed between them;
- (5) a person appointed by Council from among the members of Council elected by Congregation who is a member of a faculty within the divisions of Humanities or Social Sciences;
- (6) a person appointed by Council from among the members of Council elected by Congregation who is a member of a faculty within the divisions of

*Text of Regulations*

In [Council Regulations 3 of 2004: Regulations for the Employment of University Staff](#), amend Table 6: Schedule of Statutory Professorships as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

‘Professor of ~~Old Age Psychiatry~~Dementia Research’.

Mathematical, Physical and Life Sciences or Medical Sciences;

(7)–(10) ~~4~~four members of Congregation elected by Congregation.

1.2. The committee shall appoint a chair from among the members of the committee in categories (1) and (2) above.

1.3. (1) The term of office of the members of the committee appointed by Council shall be determined by Council in each case up to a maximum of ~~3~~three years and may extend beyond the term of each individual’s membership of Council. No external member of Council shall serve on the committee when ~~their~~his/her own reappointment to Council is being considered. Members of the committee appointed by Council shall be eligible for reappointment but shall not serve for more than ~~6~~six years in total. Members of the committee elected by Congregation shall serve for ~~3~~three years and shall be eligible for re-election for ~~1~~one further and final period of office.

(2) Where the exercise has begun to identify an external member of Council under regulation 1.4(3), a committee member’s term shall be automatically extended until the completion of that exercise. A new committee member may be appointed to replace the member whose term has expired, so that 2 members fill the same position concurrently, but the new member shall not participate in the current exercise. For the avoidance of doubt, an ex officio member’s term shall not be extended and the individual who replaces such a member shall participate in the current exercise in place of the outgoing individual.

~~(3)~~(2) No external member of Council serving on the committee shall attend meeting(s) when the nomination of ~~their~~his/her successor to Council is

being considered or have any part in the consideration of ~~their~~<sup>his or her</sup> successor.

1.4. The committee shall:

(1) establish (in consultation with Council), publish, and keep under review and submit for approval by Council the criteria for the selection or election of members of Council;

(2) in the event of expiry of term of a serving external member of Council appointed under section 4 (7)–(10) of Statute VI:

(a) the General Purposes Committee shall consider the renomination and, if the serving external member is willing to be renominated, shall make a recommendation to Council at its first meeting in the term before the vacancy is due to occur;

(b) (i) Council shall consider the recommendation and shall either propose the candidate put forward under sub-paragraph (a) above for approval by Congregation or shall refer the matter to the Nominations Committee;

(ii) when referring the matter to the Nominations Committee or when considering the steps to be taken in the event that the candidate is rejected by Congregation, Council may ask the committee to identify a different candidate from among candidates considered for another external vacancy on Council, to instigate a new search for candidates in accordance with paragraph (3) below or to exercise its own discretion in making a decision between these two courses of action;

(c) in the absence of directions from Council to the contrary, if the candidate is rejected by Congregation, the Nominations Committee shall exercise its own discretion in making a decision between the two courses of action under sub-paragraph (b) (ii);

(3) in the event of a vacancy in Council under section 4 (7)–(10) of Statute VI for an external member of Council to be nominated by Council and approved by Congregation other than a renomination considered under paragraph (2) above:

(a) the committee shall by advertisement in the *University Gazette*, invite written nominations of candidates from any member of Congregation. The notice shall be published to allow a period of at least ~~21~~<sup>twenty-one</sup> days in Full Term between the date of the invitation in the *Gazette* and the closing date by which nominations must be received;

(b) the committee shall also agree what additional methods should be used to identify possible candidates;

~~(c)~~<sup>(b)</sup> after the closing date the committee shall consider all the nominations it has received and those candidates proposed by its own members, select from them having due regard to the principles of equality and diversity and agreed selection criteria, and make recommendations to Council;

~~(d)~~<sup>(e)</sup> Council shall consider all recommendations received from the Nominations Committee and shall either propose one candidate for each vacancy for approval by Congregation or shall ask the committee to submit further names for its consideration;

~~(e)~~<sup>(d)</sup> if a candidate is rejected by Congregation the committee shall propose a further candidate or candidates to be put to Council in accordance with sub-paragraph (b) above, or, if necessary, by readvertising the vacancy in the *University Gazette* in accordance with sub-paragraph (a) above, until each vacancy is filled;

(4) advise Council on such other aspects of the membership of Council as may be requested by Council from time to time.

1.5. The committee shall make reports to Council and to Congregation as appropriate on the matters set out in 1.4.'

## (c) Professor of Poetry

### *Explanatory Note*

These changes are proposed to follow the example of the regulations for the Election of the Chancellor of the University (the other election by Convocation at the University), that require the announcement of the result of the election to be published in the *University Gazette* but not to a meeting of Convocation. This change will allow for greater flexibility in the delivery of any in-person announcement of the result of an election of a Professor of Poetry. Numbers are also being written as numerals rather than words, in line with Oxford style guidance.

### *Text of Regulations*

In [Council Regulations 8 of 2002](#), concerning Convocation Elections, amend the regulations on the Election of the Professor of Poetry as follows (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

#### **‘Election of the Professor of Poetry**

4. The election to fill a vacancy, other than a casual vacancy, in the office of Professor of Poetry shall take place not later than the term before the vacancy will arise and, in the case of a casual vacancy in the office of the Professor of Poetry, the election shall take place as soon as may be after the occurrence of the vacancy (subject to the provisions of regulation 1 above).

5. The Professor of Poetry shall be elected in accordance with the following procedure:

- (1) The Professor of Poetry Election Committee shall oversee the election process.
- (2) The committee shall consist of:
  - (a) a member of the Faculty of English Language and Literature, appointed by the General Purposes Committee of Council, who shall chair the committee;
  - (b) ~~3~~three academic representatives of the Humanities Division, appointed by the Division;
  - (c) ~~1~~one of the Proctors or the Assessor as may be agreed between them;
  - (d) ~~1~~one member of the Governing Body of All Souls College, appointed by the Governing Body;
  - (e) ~~2~~two external members with relevant experience/expertise in the writing of or study of poetry, appointed by the General Purposes Committee of Council;

(f) a student member representative, usually the President of the Oxford University Poetry Society, or their nominee.

- (3) The committee may co-opt up to ~~2~~two additional members for such periods as the committee shall deem appropriate.
- (4) The Director of Public Affairs and Communications, or their nominee, shall be in attendance.
- (5) The committee shall report to the General Purposes Committee of Council and Council as necessary.
- (6) The committee shall be responsible for:
  - (a) determining the timeline for the election process, including the date by which nominations must be received and the date of the election;
  - (b) approving the role specification for the post and determining the information to be provided by candidates;
  - (c) inviting written nominations from potential candidates, from within the University and from the public;
  - (d) ascertaining the willingness of candidates to stand for election.
- (7) The date of the election is here understood to be the day the poll closes, after which time it is no longer possible to cast a vote: and not the date the results are announced.
- (8) After the closing date for nominations, the committee shall consider all the nominations it has received, and, having due regard to the principles of equality and diversity and the approved role specification, shall determine which candidates will progress to the next stage of the selection process.
- (9) If the committee determines that only ~~1~~one nominated candidate will progress to the next stage of the selection process or if only one ~~1~~one remains after other nominated candidates have withdrawn that candidate shall be deemed to be duly elected from the date appointed for the election; and the result of the election shall be published in the *University Gazette*.
- (10) If the committee determines that no nominated candidate will progress to the next stage of the selection process, or all those nominated have withdrawn, Council shall have power to nominate a candidate, and such a candidate shall then be declared

to be duly elected; and the result of the election shall be published in the *University Gazette*.

(11) If the committee determines that more than 1one nominated candidate will progress to the next stage of the selection process, an election by Convocation shall be held as follows:

(a) The form of the voting-paper, and the method of casting votes, shall be prescribed by the Vice-Chancellor.

(b) The Registrar shall be responsible for the counting of the votes but the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors shall decide on the validity of any vote which, in the opinion of the Registrar, is in doubt.

(c) In the case of an equality of votes, the Vice-Chancellor shall decide between the candidates.

~~(d) The Vice-Chancellor and Proctors shall attend at the place and day fixed for the meeting of Convocation to announce the results of the election during such times as the Vice-Chancellor shall determine (these times having been published in the *University Gazette* when the notice of the meeting was given).~~

(d)(e) The result of the election shall be published in the *University Gazette*.’

## Congregation 13 October

The following legislative proposals and resolutions will be deemed to be approved at **noon on 13 October** unless by that time the Registrar has received notice in writing from 2 or more members of Congregation that they wish the resolution to be put to a meeting of Congregation.

### (1) Voting on Legislative Proposal: Statute VII: Libraries, Museums and Scientific Collections, and the University Press

#### *Explanatory note*

With the increased importance of assessment and associated services in the University Press's broader publishing strategy, it is desirable to make explicit reference to assessment and associated services (eg teacher training and educational data analytics).

*WHEREAS it is expedient to clarify the function of the University Press, THE UNIVERSITY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS.*

#### *Text of Regulations*

In [Statute VIII \(Libraries, Museums and Scientific Collections, and the University Press\)](#), amend §15 (new text underlined, deleted text struck through):

'15. The function of the Press is to further the University's objects ~~by~~through publishing, ~~assessment,~~ and the provision of associated services, in any medium anywhere in the world.'

### (2) Voting on Legislative Proposal: Statute X: Degrees, Diplomas, and Certificates

#### *Explanatory Note*

The degree of Master of Public Health (MPH) is being added to the list of degrees awarded by the University, due to the establishment of a new degree, MPH in Public Health Research, in the Nuffield Department of Population Health.

*WHEREAS it is expedient to add Master of Public Health to the University's list of degrees it awards, THE UNIVERSITY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS.*

#### *Text of Regulations*

In [Statute X: Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates](#) concerning degrees, diplomas and certificates, amend as follows (new text underlined):

### (3) Voting on a Resolution authorising the allocation of space in Radcliffe Observatory Quarter New Radcliffe House to Uehiro Oxford Institute

#### *Explanatory Note*

As required by section 4 of Statute XVI, approval of this resolution is requested because of the size of the proposed space allocation.

The Uehiro Oxford Institute has reached operational capacity in its current accommodation within Littlegate House on St Ebbe's Street. Accommodation is dispersed across 2 floors and is at some distance from cognate activity within the Humanities Division on the Radcliffe Observatory Quarter (ROQ). Following the Department of Experimental Psychology's relocation to the Life and Mind Building, approximately 1,022 sqm net usable area on the first floor of ROQ New Radcliffe House is available and has been identified as the preferred option for the institute's relocation and expansion. Fit-out and reconfiguration of the floor will be funded by a philanthropic pledge made in support of this allocation. Allocation is sought on a non-time-limited basis to reflect the institute's establishment as a lasting institutional base in Oxford for research, education and public engagement in practical ethics, and to support the substantial reconfiguration of the floor funded by the philanthropic pledge in support of the relocation.

#### *Text of Resolution*

That approximately 1,022 sqm net usable area within ROQ New Radcliffe House (building 553) be allocated to the Uehiro Oxford Institute, from 1 August 2026, on a non-time limited basis.

#### *Meeting information*

Members of Congregation are reminded that any 2 members may, not later than **noon on 5 October**, give notice in writing to the Registrar that they wish to oppose or amend legislative proposals at (1) and (2) above or the resolutions (3) and (4) above (see the note on the conduct of business in Congregation below). If no such notice has been given, and unless Council has declared otherwise or the meeting has been adjourned the legislative proposals and resolutions shall be declared carried, and the meeting may be cancelled.

### (4) Voting on a Resolution authorising the allocation of space in Osney Holywell House to the Department of Engineering Science

#### *Explanatory Note*

As required by section 4 of Statute XVI, approval of this resolution is requested because of the size of the proposed space allocation.

The Department of Engineering Science currently occupies Osney Holywell House under a 5-year allocation expiring on 4 July 2026. The original allocation supported the establishment of a Mini TESA (The Energy Systems Accelerator) within the building. The activity has subsequently developed to encompass the operational base of the multi-disciplinary ZERO Institute (Zero-carbon Energy Research Oxford), the delivery of the MSc in Energy Systems, and a wider Oxfordshire Clean Tech ecosystem. Continued occupation supports the department's longer-term consolidation within the planned Engineering Campus at Osney Mead, the commencement of construction of which is identified in the University's 2025–2030 Strategic Plan as 1 of 3 priorities for the estate. Allocation renewal is sought on a non-time-limited basis to reflect the multi-phase delivery of the Engineering Campus, which may extend significantly beyond the initial first-phase availability date, and the absence of any comparable space within the University estate to accommodate the activities now delivered from the building.

#### *Text of Resolution*

That approximately 819 sqm net usable area within Osney Holywell House (building 963) be allocated to the Department of Engineering Science, on a non-time-limited basis from 5 July 2026.
