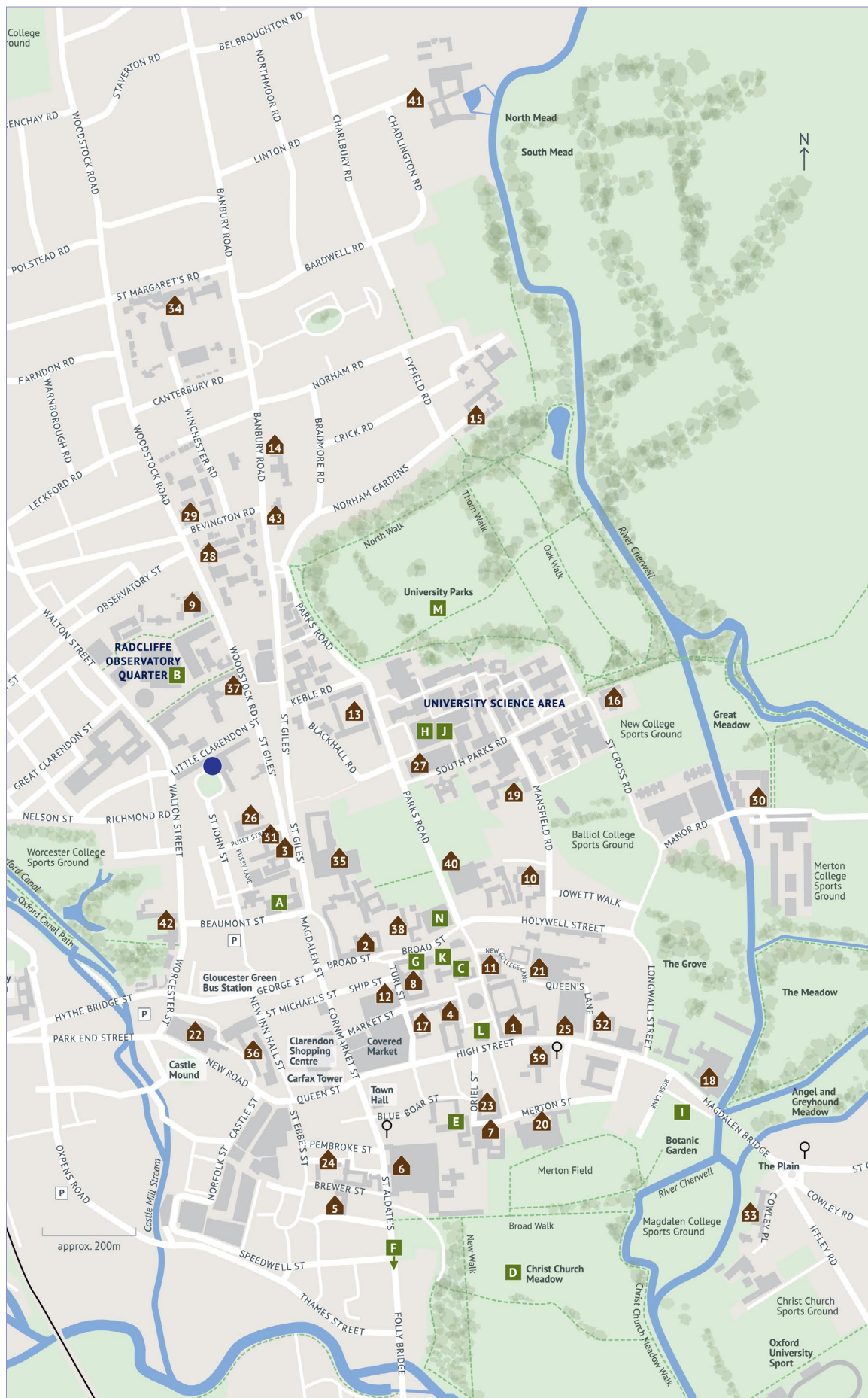

Groups should check if they need to book in advance.

We want you to enjoy your visit, but please remember that our colleges and halls are places of residence, work and study, and you are asked not to enter staircases, rooms and areas marked as private. All visitors should report to the Lodge on arrival. Dogs, except assistance dogs, are not allowed in colleges and halls.

Oxford is a beautiful city of stunning architecture, history and culture. You'll find ancient and modern colleges, fascinating museums and galleries, and plenty of parks, gardens and green spaces in which to relax. D Christ Church Meadow

1 All Souls College

Open: Public welcome to visit College Front and Great Quadrangles and Chapel as individuals or groups (up to 6) 14:00–16:00 on weekdays and Sundays. Please note that the College is closed to the public over Easter, Christmas and for the whole month of August. The College may also close at short notice if necessary.

Visitors advised to contact the Porters' Lodge on the number above to check the College is open (and any parts that may be closed) before visiting. Prospective students and Exeter College alumni are welcome to visit Exeter's Turl Street site for free, daily between 9:00–17:00, unless there is a special event taking place in the College.

Charge: Entrance £4 (free for children up to 12). Bodleian Card holders and Oxford Alumni Card holders can visit for free, daily 14:00–17:00, provided they have their card with them and the College is not closed for a special event.

Note: Exeter College Chapel services are open to all. Exeter's Cohen Quad, on Walton Street, is open to current members of the University and Exeter College alumni with identification. Cohen Quad is not generally open to the public, except for public events. The College Library is closed to visitors as it is a place of quiet study. If you wish to see the Library, you must make an appointment with the Development office, email: development@exeter.ox.ac.uk

Note: Self-guided tours: Pre-booking for a group of 15 or below is not required unless wanting to secure a specific time or pay via invoice. Maximum of 3 groups can tour at once. Larger groups will be divided, with one designated adult leading each subgroup. All visitors under 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Card payments only at the Lodge. No cash payments. Assistance dogs are welcome.
